SPECIFIC COMPLAINT(S):

The Pennsylvania Leadership Charter School (PLCS) failed to implement the child find procedures.

§ 300.111 Child find.

FINDINGS:

grandmother, reported that in October of 2008 parents requested an evaluation due to an accident that happen to in December of 2007 which caused a brain injury. The PLCS declined this request because had only been in the school for three days.
The NOREP, dated October 22, 2008 indicates that the request was being rejected at this time, being that enrolled into our district cyber environment only three days ago. The school will instead be monitoring progress for a term of 30 days. After 30 days, the Coordinator of Student Interventions will reconvene a meeting with mother, to determine if any further action is needed.
The documentation from Tara Adams indicates that in October 2008 a 504 Service Agreement was discussed and it was decided that it would be needed for to be successful. A 504 Plan was to be completed.
The 504 Service Agreement indicates it was developed on April 15, 2009.
The Academic Report indicates that did not make progress the second and third quarters, receiving "F's" in all subjects.
Documentation from Ms. Adams indicates that on March 26, 2009 a referral packet, request form and the Permission to Evaluate was mailed out. On May 7, 2009 Ms. Starr reported to Ms. Adams that she completed all of the forms and sent them back to the district. Ms. Adams reported that she received the referral packet but did not receive the Permission to Evaluate. Ms. Adams resent the Permission to Evaluate. The Permission to Evaluate was received to the school district on May 28, 2009.
CONCLUSIONS:
The PLCS was unable to demonstrate compliance with § 300.111 Child find.
CLOSURE/CORRECTIVE ACTION:
The PLCS shall complete an evaluation for by June 30, 2009. If is determined to be eligible for Special Education Services the school district shall convene an Individualized Education Program (IEP) Team meeting and provide compensatory education in the amount of 655 hours (131 days x 5 hours) of compensatory education. The PLCS shall provide a copy of the NOREP and the compensatory education agreement to this Complaint Specialist, delivered to the Division of Monitoring and Improvement-West, August 15, 2009.
If does not qualify for Special Education Services, the 504 Services Agreement team shall reconvene and determine compensatory education in the amount of 560 hours (112 days x 5 hours) by June 30, 2009. The district shall forward a copy of the compensatory education agreement to this Complaint Specialist, delivered to the Division of Monitoring and Improvement-West by August 15, 2009.

The PLCS shall provide training to all staff and administration with regards to § 300.111 Child find by September 1, 2009. The district shall forward a copy of the agenda and sign in sheet to this Complaint Specialist, delivered to the Division of Monitoring and Improvement-West by September 15, 2009.
